

Member Responsibilities

Attendance:

1. The Club expects members to attend at least 50% of the meetings (and service events) in a six month period. If you're unable to attend a meeting / event, you can make up that meeting by attending a meeting of another Rotary club. For instance, if you're on a business trip, you might attend a Rotary club meeting in another city. You can also make up a meeting by attending an e-club meeting online.

Financial Obligations:

1. Club members currently pay \$115 dues annually. This dues payment covers the cost of dues paid to Rotary International and to Rotary District 7980 which includes a subscription to "The Rotarian" monthly magazine. Club members also pay \$40 per month fees which cover the cost of administrative expenses and includes breakfast at the weekly morning meetings. Members are also encouraged to contribute annually to the Rotary International Foundation and the Ledyard Rotary Foundation.

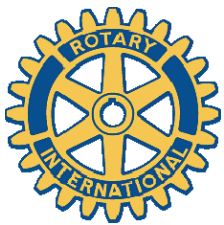
